Leaders Guide

Registration: All units should register at any Wolf River district roundtable or by contacting Webelos Encampment chairman Valerie Schlichter or Erica Brumfield prior to roundtable March 6, 2012. After that packs can still register but will be charged a late fee of \$5.00 per person and will not be guaranteed a patch. Late registration will end on March 23, 2012. Registration will include 1 patch per person registered. Please make checks payable to Chickasaw Council.

Registration includes: Registration form and Participant Roster form from each den that is participating in this event along with appropriate fees. Current Medical forms, Parts A & B, for all adults and Scouts need to be with units and provided at check in. The medical forms can be found at www.chickasawbsa.org. We need to Be Prepared for food allergies, medical conditions, etc.

Cost per Scout is \$12.00 (late fee \$5.00 March 6, 2012-March 23, 2012)
Cost per leaders and adults \$8.00 (late fee \$5.00 March 6, 2012-March 23, 2012)

Directions to Navy Lakes: Travel north on HWY 51 towards Millington, turn east on Navy Road (Point of Reference: Uhaul) and go 3.4 miles to Beuthel Road. Turn left onto Beuthel Road and go north 1.9 miles to Kerr-Rosemark Road (Point of Reference: Bethel Baptist Church). Turn left and go 0.4 miles to the Lakehouse.

Camp Sites: Each leader will need to check in with the event staff before setting up camp. Instructions as to where to set up your unit's camp site will be given to you at this time. Campfires will not be allowed in individual camp sites, only charcoal or camp stoves may be used.

Cracker Barrel: Every unit should have at least one leader in attendance to receive any last minute instructions for the next day. Please provide any last minute registrations at this time.

Campfire: Everyone will need to bring a drink to the campfire with them. Popcorn will be provided during our campfire. Also each den will need to be prepared with a den yell and skit.

Volunteers: Adult volunteers are needed to insure the success of this event by assisting with the planned activities. Each unit will be required to provide 1 adult for every 1-5 Scouts registered. We will need volunteers to teach activity badges, run afternoon events, help with campfire program and lead Sunday devotional. Adult volunteers will need to specify where they would like to help on the registration form. Boy Scouts over the age of 14 needing service hours are invited to help as well. Once registration is complete we will have a staff meeting prior to this event with all our volunteers. Thanks in advance for your help.

Each den leader will rank in order of preference the classes you wish your Webelos Scouts to take. Dens will be able to take two Webelos activity badges. Classes will be assigned on a first come, first served basis with Webelos I dens having preference over Bear dens. Classes will not be chosen by individual Scouts, only by dens. At the conclusion of this event a list of requirements completed by the Scouts will be provided to each den leader via email.

Scheduled Activities: A round robin will be held with the following activities. Each den will be given a set of clues that they must figure out so that they know which activity they are scheduled to be at.

- *Survivor Bracelets-Each Scout will make one bracelet to donate to the military and one for themselves to take home.**
- *Shooting Sports-We will be offering BB-Guns, Archery, or Sling Shots depending on which one we can procure supplies for.**
- *Knowledge Bowl-Scouts will be asked questions regarding their knowledge of Cub Scouting, citizenship, Boy Scouting etc.**
- *Games-Scouts will participate in several Scouting games: Kim’s game, Compass relay, Fold a Flag, and Saving a Life (uses knot tying)**

Camp Site Inspection: On Saturday all of the campsites will be inspected for the following items. All units who are participating on a day trip basis will have their gathering areas inspected as well.

- 1. Guide to Safe Scouting
Parental contact information**
- 2. Tents properly set up and orderly**
- 3. Water supply present for cooking, drinking, handwashing (may use non-water hand cleansers)**
- 4. Personal gear properly stored (If tent flaps are open then gear inside must be neat and orderly)**
- 5. First Aid Kit properly displayed and ready to use**
- 6. Cooking and Dining areas clean and organized**
- 7. Dishwashing facilities evident**
- 8. Items posted: Pack Identification, Menus, Event Schedule and Duty Rosters**
- 9. Disposal area for garbage and waste**
- 10. Vehicles parked in designated parking area
(Vehicle towing trailer and handicap vehicles may park at camp site)**
